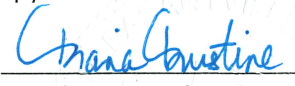


MINUTES

Committee Reports <i>Management Finance</i> Vice-President Long	Nothing to report.																								
<i>Public Works Streets/Properties</i> President Crawford	Flags and banners will be going up. Guys have been working hard keeping up with mowing. They will be weed killing along the baseball fences to help eliminate the need for trimming.																								
<i>Recreation Board</i> President Crawford	Mayor Long questioned whether President Crawford said anything to the Rec Board about the recent damages. He said he made it clear to one member that the council is not going to keep doing this and would like to speak with the head guy who works out of town and is hard to get a hold of. He went on to say that if the board keeps letting these things happen, they will have to pay for repair materials and labor. The member let President Crawford know they are having trouble getting volunteers. There was a short discussion of increased expenses, teams getting smaller, and the conclusion that it seems like rec leagues are unfortunately going away.

PERSONNEL President Crawford	Mark and Skip are taking classes every Tuesday for 12 weeks for their wastewater treatment licenses. The free training is offered by PA Rural Water.
EXPENDITURES	Motion by Councilwoman Griffin, second by Vice-President Long and carried unanimously to pay the bills. (4/12-4/25 in the amount of \$36,924.96)
ROUND TABLE	Mayor Long brought up the fact that there is no news going out about council meetings other than when the meetings are. She asked if there is anything she can give Nancy Mulvin when she calls in every Monday night about council. Public notices and newsletters going out, as well as, minutes on the website, and a new editor with the Titusville News Journal were brought up. Yard sales are May 31 st -June 1 st . The first quarterly report for the new Household Hazardous Waste was received. Four residents participated and 214 pounds of electronics were collected. The May water bill mailing going out April 25 th will remind residents of the availability of the program. Also, Waste Management missed billing for the first two quarters and will send a catch-up bill out in the third quarter. Customers will see a \$1.61/month extra charge for January-September. Mayor Long added Waste Management needs to have better communication with recycling delays. She went on to say that they point everyone to the website and the information on there isn't always accurate.
