OPEN MEETING INVOCATION/PLEDGE	The meeting was opened by Council President Howard Crawford. The invocation was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Martha Long, President Howie Crawford, Vice-President Mary Long, Councilwoman Pam Griffin, Councilwoman Kathie McMunn, Councilman Bob Rigby, and Secretary Diana Durstine were present.
APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES	Motion by Councilwoman Griffin, second by Councilwoman McMunn and carried unanimously to accept the minutes of the regular meeting of January 23, 2024.

CORRESPONDENCE	A rate increase notice from Armstrong was received by all Council members.
OLD BUSINESS <i>ClimaVision Lease Agreement</i>	Comments were received back from Borough Solicitor Rich Winkler. After a short discussion a vote was tabled to give Council more time to look the agreement and solicitor's comments over. It was agreed to forward the solicitor's comments to Bryce at ClimaVision.
<i>Holiday Decorations</i>	There was discussion regarding existing Christmas wreaths and the need to make sure all bulbs are lit. No decision to purchase additional items was made.

Committee Reports <i>Management Finance</i> Vice-President Long	The Crawford County Tax Collection Committee annual meeting is Thursday.
<i>Public Works</i> <i>Streets/Properties</i>	Everything is moving along fine. President Crawford will visit the residents on Bank Street regarding drainage issues during rain events. The area was reviewed with Troy Cyphert from PennDot and it was determined any fix was the Borough's responsibility.
<i>Recreation Board</i> President Crawford	Nothing to report.
<i>Recycling/Solid Waste</i> Councilwoman Griffin	Borough employee Skip Crawford let council know permission was given to Waste Management truck drivers after they asked if they would be allowed to park at the Borough Garage to take their lunch or break or whatever they need to do while they are on their route for the day. They had been parking at the firehall but were recently told they were no longer allowed to do so.
<i>Comments & Concerns</i> Councilwoman McMunn	No problems, but under recycling solid waste, a garbageman was seen taking video of a neighbor's garbage. The worker initially left the can but took the contents of the can and four boxes when he came back through.

PERSONNEL

No problems with personnel. Mark has gone around 3 times now with Lynn learning where to read meters. Two big water leaks were fixed. Daily usage is down 35,000 gallons per day. New pit meters are being put in.

ROUND TABLE

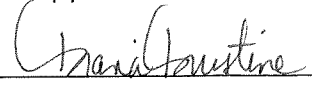
