Vice-President Long added the Borough didn't have to pay someone to do it. Secretary Durstine added the savings on mowing. Mayor Long added it's so convenient to use and has really already paid for itself. Mayor Long questioned if anything had been heard on the missing yard sale signs. She had been hearing it was probably kids. There is one sign left.
