OLD BUSINESS

President Crawford let Council know that things are still being checked in to with the water project.

Vice-President Long provided an update regarding the Hazard Mitigation Plan meeting she attended. The last update for the plan was five years ago and the Council did not need to do much because Jeff Presto is the EMA for the Borough, Oil Creek, and Allegheny Township. The County required by FEMA to have everyone participate in the plan that has to be implemented for 2025. Other municipalities were putting in plans for things like reenforcing dams and from previous discussions, the only thing the Borough could possibly have happen is a semi carrying a chemical and leaks. The first requirement is that a representative from the Borough attend the meeting. Second, forms need to be filled out and Jeff will be doing that. Third is a follow-up meeting in November. Vice-President Long will follow-up with Jeff.

NEW BUSINESS

President Crawford let Council know the Borough is waiting for Titusville to set up a meeting regarding the Water Agreement that is up at the end of July. Oil Creek Townships and Allegheny Township are being included. If an agreement is not reached the existing agreement would continue for six months.

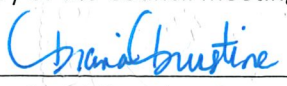

President Crawford provided an update that some of the repairs need to be done at the same time. Like the tank needs to be drained to be able to put the new valve and seals in, as well as the new pipe installation in the one section to eliminate the need to have a boat do the installation when the tank is full. The bottom of the tank builds up sludge and there is no record of the tank ever being cleaned. This has some of the air pipes plugged off, so when the tank is empty that can also be taken care of as well. Guys including Borough guys are going to come in all at one time to get it done. Mayor Long commented that all the decorations look nice around town. President Crawford added that he loves decorations and seeing them out at all the entrances into town. No matter where you come in to town people see them, like them, and compliment them. Vice-President Long added the decorations give life to the community and that it's not just another drive through.
