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APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES	Motion by Councilwoman McMunn, second by Councilwoman Griffin and carried unanimously to accept the minutes of the regular meeting of March 12, 2024, with corrections: depth to get to good water was to the second level, not 1,000 feet and the motion second for paying the bills was Vice-President Long.																								
2024 Paving Bid Award	President Crawford attended the bid opening at the March 21st COG meeting in Oil City. There were six bidders. Hawbaker was the low bidder for the paving of South Main Street and Maple Street. Motion by Councilwoman McMunn, second by Councilman Rigby and carried unanimously to accept the low bid of Hawbaker in the amount of \$122,320.																								
RECOGNIZE VISITORS	EADS Group – Josh Kalp & Beau Shettler 1 - Every year DEP requires the Borough submit a Chapter 94 report telling them how the operations have been for the year. The main takeaway from the report is that hydraulically, the plant is operating at about 38% of the full capacity and organically at 18%. The plant is working really well and has the capacity to add on. 2 – EADS met with the Oil Creek Township Supervisors two weeks ago regarding the configurations of their pump stations. The review was not as bad as what he expected. The biggest issue they have with them is that the capacity of them is extremely large for the amount of customers they have tied in to their system. 3 – EADS met with a meter sales rep at the wastewater treatment plant and are awaiting quotes to put in an influent meter. President Crawford questioned why there are two meters. Josh said larger plants usually have two and flow in equals flow out over a different time period. Two meters are nice to have, however, DEP only requires one to be at the plant. The plant has been operating since 2010 with the current flow meters.
