OLD BUSINESS																									
<i>Furnace Update</i>	President Crawford let council know there is one quote in so far for the replacement of the furnace and adding air conditioning at the Borough Office. Quotes for the system at the sewer plant have not been received yet.																								
<i>Climavision Installation Update</i>	Climavision would like to know if council or anyone else would like to be onsite on 10/8 for the lift of the radar. Vice-President Long mentioned the elementary school might want to bring the kids over for a field trip. President Crawford added the school would want and specific time and installation is dependent on the weather.																								
<i>Waste Management At Your Door Service</i>	A complaint came from a frustrated resident that called to have a pick-up and was told it wouldn't be picked up until October 28 th . A new rep called to introduce himself and explained that Waste Management could provide education to residents to increase the utilization of the program which in turn would put pick-up dates sooner. The new rep would like to know if council would like to continue the program again next year. Vice-President Long had to wait three weeks but added with the program being newly adopted having more information may increase participation. Councilwoman McMunn forgot to put her items out for her second pickup and had to make another appointment. But after her one large pickup she said it was well worth it. Mayor Long said the program worked to their advantage as they had two successful pickups.																								
<i>Radar Speed Signs</i>	The project is at the permit stage with PennDOT. One of the locations requires placement of a new speed limit sign. Dustin did an inventory and there are 20 speed limit signs in the borough that are no longer reflective, and need replaced. There are also six street name signs that need replaced and there is money in liquid fuels. The flashing school sign is very old and could be replaced as well. Contact the school. Motion by Councilwoman McMunn second by Vice-President Long and carried unanimously to purchase the 26 traffic signs.
