CORRESPONDENCE <i>ClimaVision Radar New Year's Day Case Study</i>	<p>President Crawford went through the email regarding the New Year's Day Radar Case Study from ClimaVision. They are very happy with how good the system is zeroing in and recording. Councilwoman McMunn questioned what good the radar is for the people of Pleasantville if there isn't any access to it. President Crawford explained that Erie Weather has a free app that uses information from the Pleasantville radar. When you tap on it, it will show the weather in motion, and you can zoom right in to your house. Mayor Long added the Erie channel WSEE is mentioning Pleasantville and how to get the app on their channel all the time.</p>																								
<i>Non-Uniform Pension Excess Employer Contribution</i>	<p>President Crawford moved on to the email from the Borough's Pension Plan Administrator regarding the 2025 reconciliation. There is \$2,492.26 of 2025 excess employer contribution that can either remain in the plan to offset 2026 pension cost or be refunded back to the Borough's general fund. Things are going good. No issues. We've gone through a lot of anti-skid this year because there has been a lot more snow and ice than there has been for years. Councilwoman McMunn reminded the Council that Maple Street did not get coated after it was paved. President Crawford talked to the guys about doing the culvert pipes on New Street and Chestnut Extension. They can get them done with enough time to settle before paving starts. Both streets have little traffic. More water leaks were taken care of. A sewer problem was taken care of on Second Street. Tree roots and home(s) flushing a lot of grease and wipes caused the blockage. The Borough's Jetter would not break through the blockage, so we had to call out a sanitation company. There was a short discussion, and Council agreed a letter should go out to the residents on Second Street as well as another note in with bills.
