*Garbage/Rubbish/Refuse
Bid Award*

Secretary Durstine reviewed the summary handout from the bid opening held 9/8. The low bid of Noble Environmental was highlighted. With representatives from two of the companies that bid in attendance, they were given the opportunity to speak.

Mike Licinski of Noble Environmental introduced himself and the company which is headquartered south of Pittsburgh. They own/operate seven landfills and three solid waste transfer stations. They recently opened the former Raccoon Refuse facility which they purchased earlier this year. Noble is new to the area, but they are not new to the industry. Noble started a new contract with Oil City July 1st, and they were the low bidder for the City of Corry as well. Corry’s award meeting is next week. Noble is hoping to continue to grow in this region and be another company that the Borough can rely on.

Mel Kirkwood from Tri-County noted his price was what customers would be paying for the next five years, and the annual cleanup was included for free. His numbers did not fluctuate on anything.

Secretary Durstine then explained how the bid was structured with weekly garbage services and then optional services for recycling, household hazardous waste, and clean-up day and optional years. With Noble being the low bid, a few of their existing customers were called for references. She clarified that Noble will be delivering carts for customers there will be no bag service.

NEW BUSINESS

Trick-or-Treating

Motion by Councilman Rigby, second by Councilwoman Griffin and carried unanimously to accept the lowest bid from Noble with optional recycling and household hazardous waste collection.

Councilwoman McMunn thanked both representatives for coming.
